GARDEN THERAPY - NURTURING WITH NATURE

We have been planting seedlings from our seed starters, broadcasting wildflower seeds, cleaning up, harvesting radishes, chard, and kale, and getting off to a good start in the gardens. This week we will harvest lettuce from the plants you brought us, Bonnie (Pennington). We are planning a trellis for the bean plants, and continue to dig up more grass each year as we slowly enlarge our space. Not pictured: banana plant, tomato plants, a pepper plant, eggplant, two varieties of sweet potato, and corn. I think we may

have lost the salvia to the deep freeze, and we are still waiting on the fig. We have a psychology intern and a mental health counselor on East unit that are starting another gardening group - exciting! We have plenty of seeds to share as they get started. Ms. Michelle added another railroad tie bed at the Treatment Mall garden - she has three now. We are talking with Engineering and Maintenance about building a compost and mulch bin next to the shed and have submitted a photo to them.

This chairman is excited to report that \$140,000 was granted to 35 worthy and notable students for the academic years 2022-2024. These funds secured and continue to assist in their educational goals and dreams. In addition, NGC & DSGC granted three students additional funds in 2022. And we are proud to announce that two of our 2023 applicants were

awarded NGC scholarships in the amount of \$3,800 each at their annual convention earlier this month:

Kaleb Bell, ABAC, Agriculture Education Major **Tyler Williamson**, UGA, Horticulture Major

Both of these students will graduate in 2024, so these funds will certainly be helpful in support of their senior year of college.

Tyler is the grandson of our dear friend Peg Glover, former Blue Star Marker State Chairman for many years, from Lincolnton. His sister Zia was a GCG & NGC Scholarship recipient, as well. Tyler plans to continue the family landscape business and bring his own ideas for expansion.

Kaleb is actively teaching and working in the community, and recently partnered with the Coastal Plains Native Plant Society as a part of his independent study. Kaleb was involved in the planting of 120 Parrot Pitcher Plants in the bogs.

Dollars Educate Scholars continues to be successful with term income of \$7,955.72. Our eight-year total income from this fundraiser is \$34,509.14. This contest is based on the total number of clubs within each district and the percentage of clubs participating within each district. All seven districts have participated in this fundraiser each year.

The **BIG** news is that for the 2nd consecutive year, **Redbud** has won and kept the Crown for the **Dollars Educate Scholars** Fundraiser! Congratulations, once again, to Redbud District Director, Gale D. Thomas! And congratulations to all our *Remarkable Redbud District Garden Clubs* for continuing to support this worthwhile Scholarship Fundraiser.
