### Callanwolde Garden Center Grounds Summer Successes!

The DeKalb Federation Garden Center has beautiful grounds that are maintained by a happy team of volunteers from six garden clubs. We meet every few weeks to water, weed and prune and do general upkeep of the garden areas.

**Recently**, we met to give the begonias a haircut. Sandy Reed advised us that the begonias would look better longer if we cut them back by half in early August. They are quite drought-tolerant plants and look great in formal containers with the addition this year of caladiums. The caladiums loved the weather we enjoyed this late spring and summer and thrived in the round containers.

The pollinator garden went crazy with weeds in the warm and wet summer days, and we spent half the workday in August just removing their unwelcome selves! One funny addition to our garden and to the formal Callanwolde gardens is the Formosa Lily. It is a tall white lily and spreads by seed. We did not plant it but somehow it found its way into our garden. Like the Easter Lily, it has a very showy tall white cluster of blooms and adds a summery flair to our gardens where so many weddings take place! It looks like a bridal bouquet.

### Georgia Regional Hospital Summer 2025 Update

We have exciting news from our friends at Georgia Regional Hospital. This summer DeKalb Federation applied on behalf of Georgia Regional Hospital for a grant, in the amount of \$725, to The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc. Garden Therapy program. The chairman of the Garden Therapy program is Glenndolyn Hallman, and she leads a committee from all seven districts and GCG President Diane Hunter. And happily, Quill Duncan also serves on the committee representing Redbud District. Let's say that we stack the deck just a little bit! The grant was funded, and Smoke Rise Morning Glories member and Activity Therapy Coordinator, Mary Cochran, received the funds in early August.

**Bonnie** Pennington and Quill Duncan visited the campus in June, and Mary advised us what the hospital garden therapy program would need for the next six months. The grant will fund the following items for the gardens at the Georgia Regional campus: an outdoor umbrella and stand, hose and hose carriage, fall vegetable starts, new blueberry shrubs and a fig tree, and mulch and straw bales to control the weeds and mud in the large vegetable garden. There are plans to do some renovation in the sensory garden and replace some plants that have died, and prune back those plants whose growth has been exuberant!

The summer crop in the vegetable garden was impacted some by our summer weather: rain and then dry spells. Strawberries were the stars this year and a huge hit with residents and staff members at several gatherings.

**The** staff and patients there benefit greatly from the support and interest we have in their growth and therapy. It is a very rewarding project for all concerned. Thank you, DeKalb Federation Friends for your gracious giving spirit.

### BLUE STAR MARKER

Lullwater Garden Club dedicated a Blue Star Memorial By-Way Marker in Lullwater Conservation Garden on June 14, 2025. The dedication ceremony was led by Lullwater Garden Club President, Nan Loftis, who provided a brief history of Druid Hills subdivision, the club and the garden. GCG Blue Star Marker Chair, Jan Thiese, read the dedication and the marker was then unveiled. GCG President Diane Hunter was present for the dedication.

A Blue Star marker is a memorial that honors all men and women who have served in the United States Armed Forces. It is a part of the Blue Star Memorial Highway system, which began as a way to recognize veterans of World War II. By-Ways Markers are mounted to a boulder or piece of granite and can be placed in civic gardens, parks and historic sites.

**Lullwater Garden Club** is located in Druid Hills, which is designated as a National Register of Historic Places site. It is known for being the last subdivision designed by Frederick Law Olmsted, the father of American Landscape Architecture.

**Lullwater Garden Club** was formed in 1928 and is a charter member of the Garden Club of Georgia. In 1931, the Lullwater Conservation Garden was established when the Candler Family gave permission to Lullwater Garden Club members to maintain a garden on a 5.25 acre of land located between Lullwater Parkway and Lullwater Road. It was originally known as the Lullwater Conservation Project.

In 1964, at a time when it was not typical for women to buy their own homes, Lullwater Garden Club purchased the land with the deed requirement that it remain a park or beautification area. Club members continue to maintain the park. In response to the growing need to train more members in basic floral design, the Conyers Garden Club is sponsoring its third basic design course in Conyers. Previously sponsored courses were held in Griffin and Conyers. The 5-class course covers the National Garden Club, Inc.'s design types and the principles and elements of design. Participants in the current course are members of various DeKalb Federation Clubs: Avondale Estates, Avon, Dunwoody, and Conyers.


Using both lectures and hands-on activities, the instructor, Gale D. Thomas, provides modeling and feedback as each participant works to complete the assigned designs. To date, classes have focused on line designs, basic line designs, mass designs, and table settings. All participants have enthusiastically produced two designs in each class, with appreciation and feedback received from the instructor. In the September 3 class, the students applied the principles and elements information and evaluated four table settings provided by Gale and one of the other students. They then created their own table settings using the applied knowledge. Future classes will focus on creative and petite designs, wreaths, and fruits and vegetables.


